A: The issue that you've created is that you are using a Multiline label and you are setting a value to it in code. Looking at your first label, you have the following: Notice how it's showing your email but it's not showing your name. It's because you have set this as a MultiLineLabel, which means it will display all of the values that are passed to it. I was able to find this by using Reflector. Here's a screenshot of the label component at that time: And here's what it's showing up like in the designer view: There's your issue. You need to remove the MultiLineLabel style from the text field as it's not needed. I'd suggest opening up the XAML Designer and double checking that there aren't any strange properties or attached events to this TextBox. The designer should be easy to get to - just click on the TextBox to open it. Here's the working version of your code:
